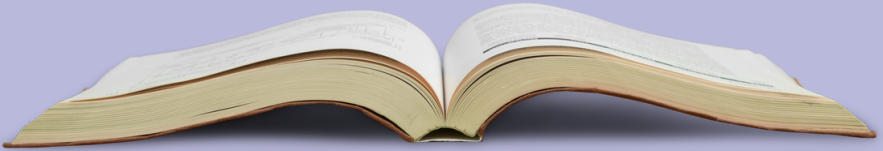

Her Story:

WOMEN'S HISTORY THROUGH AN EQUITY LENS



This talk examines the shifting political context of women's equality to understand historical and contemporary issues facing U.S. women as a social class, including: unequal political representation, poverty, social violence, the wage gap, the glass ceiling, second shift labor, and leaky pipelines.

(Ph.D. University of Maryland) is a Professor of Communication and Director of the Gender Studies Program at the University of Arkansas.

Her first book, *Prison Power: How Prison Politics Influenced the Movement for Black Liberation* (University Press of Mississippi, 2016), is the recipient of TWO national book awards from the National Communication Association. Her second book was just released and is titled, *Black Feelings: Race and Affect in the Long Sixties* (University Press of Mississippi, 2020).

Dr. Corrigan also co-hosts a popular podcast with Laura Weiderhaft called *Lean Back: Critical Feminist Conversations*.
